Project Update: Save Our Sundial!

Private gifts to one's city has a long tradition in Denver. During his third administration from 1916 - 1918, Mayor Robert Speer started the "Give While You Live" campaign. The idea was to encourage citizens to make large donations for civic beautification projects in Denver's parks. As a result, the city inherited a legacy of fine fountains, important statuary, impressive gateways, and other valued features.

Mayor Ben Stapleton and other civic leaders continued to invest in Denver's extensive city and mountain parks system, making it one of the best in the country. Carrying on this fine tradition of his predecessors, Mayor William McNichols conceived the idea of a non-profit organization dedicated to raising private funds for improvements to the City's extensive inventory of open space. In 1969, The Park People was born.

Today we are currently underway raising private funds to assist Denver Parks and Recreation in the rehabilitation of one of the City's most cherished gifts: the Cranmer Park Sundial and Plaza. Built

by the Works Progress Administration in the 1930s, the sandstone plaza and terrazzo mosaic panorama depicting the Front Range mountains visible from the park has deteriorated. It needs a rehabilitation to correct the effects of many years' exposure to Colorado's freeze-thaw weather and underlying structural issues. Currently, the City of Denver has committed \$545,000 to the project through the Departments of Parks & Recreation and Arts & Venues.

The Park People adopted this project just over a year ago, and is working with concerned citizens from the Hilltop neighborhood to raise the remaining funds to complete the rehabilitation. To date, we have raised over \$300,000 in donations from individuals and family foundations. We have secured a \$35,000 planning grant from the State Historical Fund (SHF). We've hosted a series of fun events in the community. In August of 2014 we hosted 700 folks at the "Here Comes the Sundial" concert in Cranmer Park, during which two families offered \$50,000 to match every dollar donated. This past July we

welcomed over 1,000 community members to our Independence Day Family Fun Festival at the park. Through a \$25,000 challenge grant via the Harmes C. Fishback Trust, the Stapleton Family partnered with us to mobilize the community to raise an additional \$25,000 in gifts around the time of the festival. In September, *The Hilltop Sundial* magazine hosted a movie night – *E.T. the Extra Terrestrial* – benefitting SOS. In October, guests joined us for a fun Casino Night event at Cableland, the official residence of the Mayor. And in November, Park Burger Hilltop donated part of an evening's proceeds to the sundial fund. A major donor fundraising campaign will kick off early in 2016, and other fundraising events and activities will continue as well.

We ask you to join us in contributing to the Save Our Sundial Fund. Following in the footsteps of our early city leaders and the founders of our organization, we believe that private investments in our city's wonderful parks system is a gift not only to ourselves, but to generations that will follow us. Help us make sure the Sundial and Sundial Plaza in Cranmer Park remain a tranquil spot for Denver residents and visitors alike to enjoy the peaceful view of the Front Range, from Pikes Peak on the south to Long's Peak on the north. Gates Tennis Center: a public facility with private club amenities

What does Gates Tennis Center have to do with The Park People?

Yes, there are trees there. Yes, it is a public facility. Yes, volunteers for The Park People may go there to play tennis. But there is a larger story here.

Charles C. Gates (Gates Rubber Company) had a vision of providing a tennis facility to the people of Denver that would enable any and all, regardless of age, income or background, to have access to a public facility to play the game of tennis. Built in 1975 the 20-court facility was the largest outdoor collection of courts in the Denver metro area. He specifically chose The Park People, a non-profit organization, to oversee management of the facility which they have done from its inception.

Its popularity is attested to by the large number of players from all over the city who sign up for league programs, lessons, tennis parties, ladders (a very popular concept and exceptionally successful at this center), and junior programs, lessons and events. Wheelchair tennis players will also be found here playing with other players in what's called 'one up/one down' events. Every Friday and Saturday you can sign up for a social mixer. There is no membership, and tennis is pay as you play.

Charles C. Gates envisioned the highest quality public facility for people of all ages, abilities & backgrounds.



In 2012, thanks to funding from the Gates Family Foundation, Tom Kaesemeyer, the United States Tennis Association, and Denver Parks & Recreation, we added a designated kids' zone for players under 10.

In September Gates hosts the largest prize money tournament in the state, attracting players of all levels. Local league players can compete at a USTA rated level, and other players, including college players and nationally ranked players, come to compete for prize money. Events include singles, doubles, mixed doubles, parent/child doubles and one up/one down. This is the largest event of the year at Gates with literally thousands of people coming to watch some really great and fun tennis over the course of the week. Proceeds for tickets sold to attend this event go to support the "Tennis for Kids" program started by The Park People. It is a scholarship program for juniors that is subsidy, need-based (up to 90%), along with private donations, to give kids the opportunity to experience the game of tennis.

Its growing success brought a need to grow the facility. In 2004 a capital campaign led by The Park People, the Gates Family Foundation, the City and County of Denver and private donations raised funds to add a sec-

ond story to the building and renovate and increase the main level for added space and efficiency. Once again there is a renovation taking place in the basement to finish the roughly 4,500 square feet of space needed for expanded staff, an event space and storage.

Gates is open year-round. Yes, we play in February if the sun's out and the courts are shoveled! From Pee Wee tennis (ages 4-8) through Juniors (8-18) to adults (you know who you are!) to adult lessons, programs and ladders, there is no excuse to overlook tennis for some great fun and exercise.

The game of Pickleball is a relatively new sport using its own racquet and ball. Using basically half of a tennis court, it is a combination of badminton, ping-pong and tennis. It seems to be really popular with the 55 and older crowd and is popular in certain regions of the country. I'm told it's a lot of fun, and one of these days I'm going to head over there to see what it's all about!

Did I mention there are trees there as well? Yes! And they are located all around the grounds shading much of the grassy areas. Gates is a great place to hang out to watch tennis if you're not playing or to relax between matches.

Emerald Ash Borer Update

Since the discovery of Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) in Boulder in 2013, the City Forester's Office has been preparing for the invasive insect's inevitable discovery in Denver. This year the Forestry staff is inventorying all the city's street trees. This city-wide inventory will be a valua-

ble tool for managing all of Denver's trees and is an important first step in assessing and managing the hundreds of thousands of ash trees. The street tree inventory will help the City Forester's staff communicate directly with property owners that have ash

trees in the public right-of-way or in their yards. The inventory is nearly half complete. In the spring, the City will roll out a public awareness campaign that will encourage everyone to identify if they have an ash tree and learn what their options are.

Quick Facts:

- Ash trees represent roughly 15% of Denver's 2.2 million trees.
- Emerald Ash Borer attacks young and mature ash trees, healthy and weak, all major North American ash species.
- EAB has yet not yet been found in Denver.
- Decisions to remove or treat a tree should be made on a case-by-case basis.



The primary way we can lessen the impact Emerald Ash Borer will have on our community is to proactively plant trees in the existing gaps in the tree canopy. Denver has some 2.2 million trees. Yet our urban tree canopy is only 40% stocked, meaning there is room for well over 3 million more trees.

Let's plant more trees now! We support residents purchasing high-quality climate-, urban- and site- appropriate trees from any nursery or garden center that sources and cares for their stock well. Then, the key is to 'Plant the Right Tree in the Right Place' (a long-held urban forestry mantra), consulting spacing guidelines and acquiring a planting permit for any public right-of-way tree.

Through our *Denver Digs Trees* program, we offer free and low-cost trees to Denver residents. The program facilitates wise planting decisions by providing information and siting and directly permitting all public right-of-way trees. While most participants will pick up their trees at nearby park sites, we provide free delivery and planting for those with physical limitations and offer the same service for a small fee to those physically able to plant their tree(s). We will accept tree applications January 1 through February 15 in preparation for the April distribution.

Did you know...

- We've distributed over 48,000 free and affordable trees to Denver residents.
- The program's roots began in 1983 with a neighbororganized effort in West Wash Park neighborhood.
- *Denver Digs Trees* provides trees to residents, businesses, nonprofit organizations, and schools.
- We provide both street and yard trees.
- Our trees typically enjoy strong survival rates (80-90%).
- We generally provide trees of 1.25" trunk diameter (5-15' tall depending on species). This size strikes a nice balance between the fast establishment time/high survival rates of smaller trees and larger trees' decreased vulnerability to vandalism.
- Participants pay only \$0, \$10, \$35 for trees that would likely retail for \$100-\$125.
- We target outreach and lowest fees to 27 low-canopy, low- to moderate- income neighborhoods.
 But all Denver residents are welcome to apply!
 Non-target neighborhood fees help us support program costs.

1,192 New Trees in Our Neighborhoods

This spring we distributed 1,192 affordable and free trees to Denver residents through our *Denver Digs Trees* program. More than 700 trees were planted in Denver's low-canopy neighborhoods that are most in need of trees. These trees will grow to cool and beautify our neighborhoods, filter air pollution, provide habitat for wildlife, improve property values, make our streets more walkable and create healthier, more vibrant communities.



Each year these 1,192 trees will...

- provide \$5,300 in energy savings
- offset 200,600 lbs of CO2
- reduce 1,480 lbs of air pollution
- manage 1,225,000 gal of storm water
- provide \$31,200 in total net benefits

They'll provide over \$1,247,400 in lifetime benefits!
