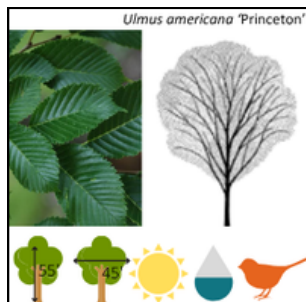


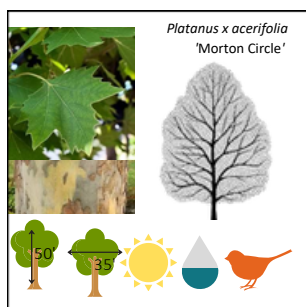


MEDIUM AND LARGE SHADE TREES



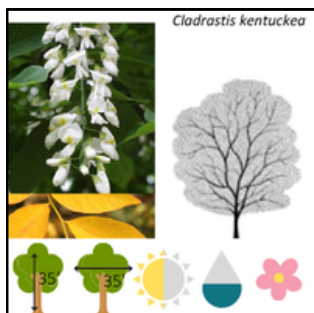
Princeton Elm

Large, graceful, vase-shaped shade tree with leathery dark green leaves turning yellow in the autumn. An American elm cultivar that shows excellent resistance to elm leaf beetle and Dutch Elm Disease. Fast growing while young, tidy and low maintenance as it matures. Elms are a keystone species which provide habitat for a wide range of butterflies, birds and other wildlife.



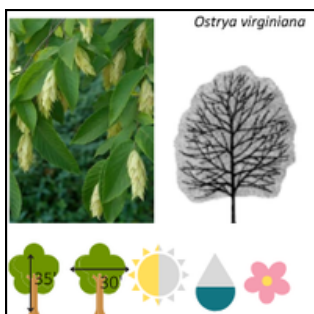
Exclamation! London Planetree

Large, bright green, maple-like leaves complement attractive mottled bark in shades of cream, olive and brown. An excellent urban tree, it offers year round interest and is tolerant of poor soils, air pollution, heat and drought. This fast-growing tree needs ample root space and is best suited to medium or large yards.



Yellowwood

Yellow heartwood gives this hardy tree its name. Features fragrant, pendulous creamy white spring flowers. Leaves open yellowish green, turning bright green in the summer, then golden yellow in the fall. Bark is an attractive light grey, but smooth and thin making it subject to winter sunscald and sunburn. Plant in the winter shade of other trees or buildings, and wrap bark for the first few winters. Prune in summer only.



American Hophornbeam

An attractive landscape tree, it develops decorative hop-like fruit clusters of pods each spring, becoming more papery and ornamental into fall. The Hophornbeam also has attractive bark and trunk features similar to its birch cousins, with gray-brown bark forming vertical strips that exfoliate at the ends, while the trunk and main branches develop a muscle-like appearance.

EVERGREEN TREES



Bosnian Pine

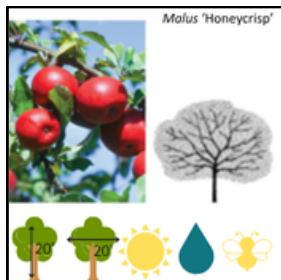
Striking and hardy conifer with a high tolerance for heat, cold, drought and poor soils including those high in salt. Symmetrical, narrow shape and dense foliage make it appropriate as an accent or screen when planted in rows or groups. Planting evergreens on the north side of homes and buildings is recommended to maximize winter screening and solar gain.

FRUIT TREES



Contender Peach

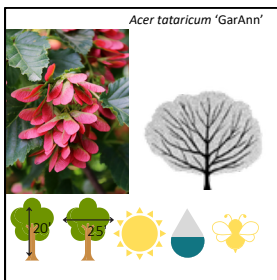
A cold-hardy selection which can tolerate spring frosts, which mean more reliable fruiting. Fragrant pink flowers appear in Spring. This variety is self-pollinating and ripens mid-to-late summer. Fruit is sweet and juicy great for fresh eating, canning, baking, and freezing.



Honeycrisp Apple

Celebrated for its crisp, sweet-tart fruit and attractive appearance. Delicate pink and white spring blossoms give way to vibrant red and yellow apples in the fall. Thrives in well-drained soil and full sunlight, offering reliable harvests with proper care. Hardy and resistant to common diseases, it's a delightful addition to garden, providing both beauty and delicious fruit.

SMALL ORNAMENTAL TREES



Hot Wings Maple

Multiple season interest: creamy white spring flowers, bright red samaras (helicopters) against dark green leaves in summer. Yellow, orange and red in fall. Hardy adaptable, and tolerant of urban pollution.

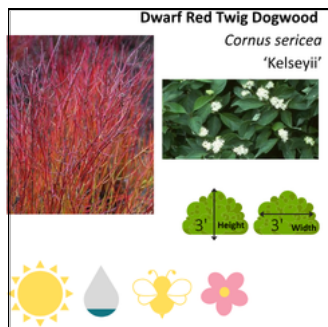


Prairifire Crabapple

Known for its intense deep pink flowers that emerge in early spring. Flowers are followed by a dark red 1/2 inch fruit that attracts wildlife and birds. Leaves emerge reddish purple and mature to a dark green. Excellent ornamental species with strong disease resistance.



SHRUBS



Dwarf Red Twig Dogwood

Compact native shrub prized for its bright red stems that provide outstanding winter color. White spring flowers, attractive berries, and excellent wildlife value make it a great four-season addition to the landscape.



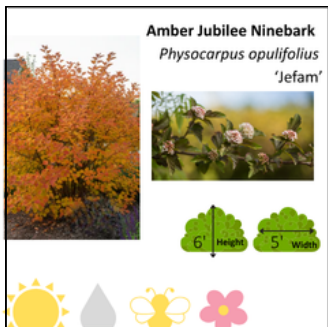
Korean Spice Lilac

A compact shrub covered in fragrant lavender-pink flowers each spring. Easy to grow and well-suited to smaller landscapes, with excellent pollinator value and beautiful seasonal color.



Manzanita 'Chieftain'

Evergreen shrub with glossy foliage, attractive reddish bark, and delicate pink spring flowers. Extremely drought tolerant once established, making it an excellent choice for water-wise landscapes.



Amber Jubilee Ninebark

Colorful, low-maintenance shrub with brilliant orange, gold, and chartreuse foliage that changes throughout the season. Features attractive peeling bark and clusters of white spring flowers that attract pollinators.

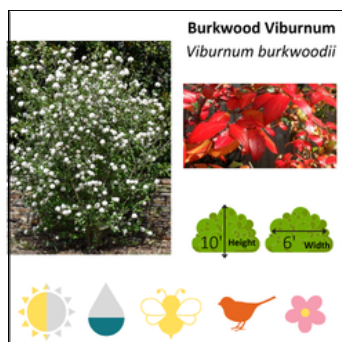


SHRUBS



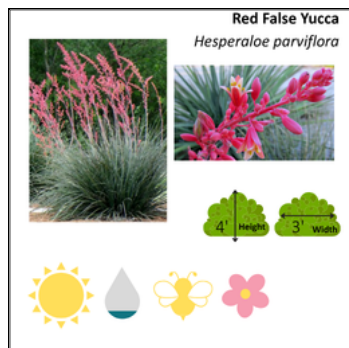
Autumn Amber Three Leaf Sumac

Tough, spreading native shrub with glossy green foliage that turns vibrant shades of orange, red, and gold in fall. Highly drought tolerant and excellent for erosion control, wildlife habitat, and naturalized landscapes.



Burkwood Viburnum

Beautiful, fragrant shrub with clusters of creamy white spring flowers followed by ornamental berries. Glossy foliage and reliable fall color provide year-round landscape interest while supporting birds and pollinators.



Red False Yucca

A striking, drought-tolerant evergreen with narrow arching leaves and tall spikes of coral-red flowers from late spring through summer. A favorite of hummingbirds and an excellent choice for xeric gardens.



Pink Flowering Almond

A charming ornamental shrub covered in double pink blossoms each spring before the leaves emerge. Its compact size and spectacular floral display make it a standout accent in the landscape.
